Il cambiamento è la condizione "naturale" delle società umane. Si tratta di modificazioni più o meno consistenti e rapide, di costumi, idee, credenze e valori. Talvolta, esse possono riguardare all'inizio un solo settore, ma esiste poi un effetto trascinamento verso altre aree per cui la tecnologia influenza l'economia con tutti relativi connessi.

Nella attuale web society anche il rapporto salute-malattia è cambiato con l'avvento di nuovi strumenti legati allo scambio, trasmissione e condivisione delle informazioni sanitarie riproponendo un nuovo rapporto medico-paziente.

Anche il mondo delle Terme, con le sue antiche tradizioni e connessioni nella storia e nella attualità della civiltà umana, non può esonerarsi da queste esigenze socio-economico ambientali e proporre a se stesso un'analisi critica propositiva di aggiornamento alle nuove realtà. E allora, compaiono alcuni interrogativi.

Le patologie legate alla pandemia COVID-19 hanno visto un ruolo appropriato della medicina termale nei trattamenti riabilitativi? Le esigenze di evidenza, razionalità, tradizione, efficacia ed efficienza, oggi richieste nella "good practice", sono realmente offerte?

A queste domande, con le relative possibili proposte di soluzione, si cercherà di rispondere con l'ampio dibattito e confronto internazionale del 73º Convegno della Femtec dedicato a "**IL TERMALISMO NELLE SOCIETÀ IN CAMBIAMENTO. Approccio multilaterale per la cura della salute e del benessere**".


